From the BAIS Chaplain's Desk

Our chapel theme for the 2016-2017 school year has been focused on the fact that we are the Body of Christ (Ephesians 2:19-22). My hope and prayer for the year has been that all of our students, preschool through twelfth grade, would arrive at the same conclusion: They have been knit together by our Creator for a specific purpose; with experiences, talents, and abilities unique to each one individually for the good of the entire Body. As the Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Corinth (1 Corinthians 12:12-31), the health and success of the Body is dependent upon each part working as it was intended in service for the good of the whole. This truth is not exclusively revealed in Scripture. God has illustrated this truth throughout human history; collectively telling the same story through individual lives and communities ranging from exploring new lands, to building barns, to winning freedom for oppressed peoples. In this one particular letter, Technical Sergeant Joe Graser was writing to his brother during World War II. As I read the letter, I discovered that if I were to substitute "Army" for "God" in my mind as I read and envisioned the collective Body of Christ as Joes community, I discovered Paul's teachings once again.

I have been wanting to tell you a few things about life in the Army... There will be times, especially at first, that you will think you never saw such bullheaded, roundabout, stupid men in your life. Many of these will by our superiors, & they will issue orders that contradict, cancel, reign you & your ideas of success. You will live next to men, that represent types only known to you in the funny papers. Lots of these will have habits that are rare.

Remember this, the Army has a reason for everything it does...Always think of that when things get pretty rough & you feel like sounding off...

This is about the men you live with, and you will find that no matter how wrong any of them are, they all have real decent ideals in their hearts.

Try to understand & appreciate all their various ways of living. I will go as far as to say that even more than in the store or school, the more friends you can make, the better off you will be...(you) are

Day and Time: Thursdays 3:40-4:40 PM


