On Saturday I had the pleasure of attending the Asian Games medal round for mens and womens volleyball. It was a great day watching some of Asia's best athletes compete and I was proud of how well the games were hosted - both in Jakarta and in Bandung at the Jalak Harupat stadium. Indonesia performed well in the games winning almost 100 medals! And, wow, South Korea won gold in mens soccer! It was great to see our Korean community all gather together to watch the games at the stadium or at various houses in KBP and Bandung. These types of international gatherings of unity and competition remind me a great deal of our BAIS community. In fact, the PACE group, just held their first meeting of the year and the opportunity was seized to strengthen our community regardless of our home cultures and heart languages. 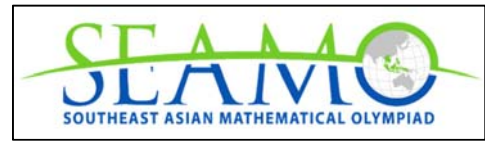
